THESE BOOKS INCLUDE JOSHUA, JUDGES, 1 AND 2 SAMUEL, 1 AND 2 KINGS, 1 AND 2 CHRONICLES, EZRA, AND NEHEMIAH. COLLECTIVELY, THEY COVER APPROXIMATELY A MILLENNIUM OF ISRAELITE HISTORY, DETAILING THE RISE AND FALL OF KINGDOMS, LEADERSHIP TRANSITIONS, AND GOD'S COVENANTAL RELATIONSHIP WITH HIS PEOPLE.

THESE BOOKS ARE OFTEN CLASSIFIED SEPARATELY FROM THE PENTATEUCH AND THE PROPHETIC OR WISDOM LITERATURE DUE TO THEIR FOCUS ON HISTORICAL NARRATIVE. WHILE THEY CONTAIN THEOLOGICAL REFLECTIONS, THEIR PRIMARY PURPOSE IS TO RECORD THE HISTORICAL EVENTS THAT SHAPED THE NATION OF ISRAEL. BOOKS OF JOSHUA AND JUDGES

BOOK OF JOSHUA

THE BOOK OF JOSHUA SERVES AS A BRIDGE BETWEEN THE PENTATEUCH AND THE HISTORICAL BOOKS BY DETAILING THE ISRAELITES' ENTRY INTO THE PROMISED LAND.
